Visa information

- Visa type: DH student visa is for study purposes only. International students holding a student visa are not allowed to engage in work or internship activities without the institution's permission.
- Process: Students can expect to receive a Visa Invitation Letter and detailed instructions on how to apply for a student visa approximately two months before the semester starts.

Cost and fees to come on exchange

- Tuition fees: Students enrolled in the exchange program do not pay tuition fees to RMIT University but continue to pay fees to their home institutions.
- <u>Health insurance</u> is mandatory for all international students while studying at RMIT Vietnam.
