

Student records and privacy

RMIT values the privacy of every individual and is committed to the responsible handling of personal information in accordance with Australian and Vietnamese data protection laws. Students aged 18 and above are considered adults and have the right to consent for the University to discuss select administrative matters with third parties. Without such consent, RMIT cannot disclose student personal information, including their enrolment, grades and financial records.

We recommend that parents and families have a talk with their students about sharing information.



Student responsibilities

- Provide up-to-date, accurate and timely student information when required.





RMIT Counselling and Psychological Services

Counsellors are available to talk about any issues students may have – whether they are personal issues, mental health and wellbeing or study-related issues.



Safer Community

If students feel unsafe and have concerns about threatening or unwanted behaviors (including bullying, sexual harassment, assault, and relationship violence), they can speak to Safer Community.



RMIT Health Centres

RMIT Health Centres are located on campus and run by a dedicated team of nurses and doctors trained in Vietnam and overseas. The centres offer routine medical consultations for acute conditions, general health education and advice, emergency services and referrals to specialist services as necessary. Students can make an appointment with the doctor of their choice or be seen on the same day without an appointment. All visits are private and confidential. There is no additional charge for all consultations and immediate treatment provided on site.



Equitable Learning and Accessibility (ELA)

Currently in Vietnam, RMIT is the first and only higher education institution which can support the needs of students who are neurodiverse or living with a disability, mental health condition, a long-term health concern or having carer responsibilities impacting their educational participation through the provision of appropriate educational adjustments.

Students can request the support and have an equitable learning plan created, which includes:

- Adjustments to their study conditions e.g. assignment extensions, alternative assessment arrangements, use of assistive devices
- · Course materials in other formats
- Student aid staff
- Assistive technology





Tips and tools for parents

As parents and families of RMIT students, you play an important role in supporting your child's academic journey. This section is designed to empower you with practical advice and best practices.

Be patient and encourage your students to be their own advocate

At RMIT, students are encouraged to act for themselves and take charge of their responsibilities. Rest assured your students are not alone. RMIT provides a wide range of resources and services to create a safe and supportive learning environment.

If your students need support or have questions but are not sure who to ask, encourage them to speak to Student Connect. Student Connect is a friendly service and is available on campus, online and via phone. They can help with a wide range of questions and requests, such as courses and programs, timetabling, fees and other administrative matters.



Offer emotional support for your students

Your students would appreciate your understanding and having you as their trusted person. Below are some tips for parents to offer emotional support for university students:

- Maintain open communication: keep lines of communication open for your child to share stories.
- Create a plan: work together to develop a plan for managing challenges and overcoming difficulties.
- Acknowledge differences: understand that university is different from high school.
- Learn about student support services:
 Familiarise yourself with available student services.
- Encourage differences: Allow space for your student to grow as this impacts positively on their mental health.

Checklist for first-semester students and families

After accepting the Offer Letter, new students should:

- Pay deposit.
- Follow RMIT instructions to set up their RMIT account.
- Plan their enrolment and class timetable.
- Join Student Orientation. During Orientation
 Week, students will get to know all student
 services and key contacts, meet new friends and
 lecturers, discover clubs and societies on
 campus and get ready to make the most of
 student life at RMIT.
- Pay tuition fees. Tuition fee invoices are available for students via their student email and myRMIT.
- For Vietnamese students, check email and provide information for national medical insurance.

How families can help:

- Arrange safe transportation and accommodation.
- Know key dates, and discuss mutual expectations for staying in touch, time management, and study skills.
- Discuss financial and payment plan with your students if possible.
- Encourage your students to participate in Orientation activities and check their student email frequently.

Buddy program

The Buddy Program pairs RMIT student volunteers with international students, providing support both on and off campus. Buddies, who are local students, offer valuable insights into Vietnamese culture and help international students make the most of their time in Vietnam.

Buddies also help to organise activities for international students including orientation, city trips and cultural tours, cooking classes, a welcome dinner, and Vietnamese language classes.

Talk to people

If students need assistance or wish to talk to someone, they can speak to our Wellbeing staff, who are available to provide confidential counselling services and support. RMIT Vietnam has been recognised internationally for its excellent support services for international students. To ensure your students have the best experience, RMIT Vietnam offers a wide range of proactive support services and activities.

- International Health Insurance is compulsory for all international students. Suitable medical insurance is arranged by RMIT Vietnam on students' behalf.
- Study visa support: International students are expected to have a valid student visa sponsored by RMIT Vietnam and comply with Vietnam immigration regulations.
- RMIT Vietnam provides a free airport pick-up service for new higher education international students.

Furthermore, international students can contact Student Connect for advice and support via different contact channels.

How to Speak RMIT

Familiarise yourself with some of the RMIT terms that your students may use and mention when sharing stories.



Words	Meaning
Assignment	Assignments are tasks or projects assigned by professors that students need to complete as part of their coursework. These can include writing essays, conducting research, solving problems, or creating presentations. Assignments help students apply what they've learned, demonstrate their understanding, and contribute to their final grades.
Deadline	Assignments have specific due dates, commonly known as "deadlines". Missing a deadline can result in a lower grade, so students need to manage their time effectively to ensure they submit their work on time.
Academic calendar	An academic calendar outlines key dates for the academic year, including semester start and end dates, public holidays, and payment due dates. This helps students manage their time effectively, including a personal development week in week 6 or week 7 for activities and workshops supporting personal and professional growth.
myRMIT	myRMIT gives students access to everything they need to manage their studies, from enrolment through to graduation, including: enrol into classes, update personal details, check timetable, view results, apply for scholarships, apply to graduate, and much more.
Semester break/Sem break	"Sem break" is short for "semester break". This is when students are not attending classes because they are between semesters. Semester breaks at RMIT typically last four weeks.
GPA	The Grade Point Average (GPA) at RMIT is a measure of a student's academic performance. It is calculated on a 4.0 scale and provides an average of the grades a student has achieved in their courses.
Credits	Students can choose to study from 1 to 3 courses (equivalent to 12 - 36 credits) in a semester.

Key dates & calendar 2025 Fees & payments

Medical insurance

Health insurance is mandatory for both international and Vietnamese students studying at RMIT Vietnam and is included in the tuition fee invoice. The University collects this fee on behalf of third parties.

For Vietnamese Students

- The University arranges health insurance through the Vietnam Social Insurance unit.
- In the first semester, after paying the fee, students must provide personal information as instructed via email from Student Billing.
- In subsequent years, insurance is automatically renewed
- Students can check their insurance details on myRMIT and contact Student Connect for enquiries.

Registration steps for First-Year Students

- Check RMIT Email: Look for a follow-up email from the Student Billing team.
- Complete the TK1 form or provide social insurance number: Fill in student's personal information and submit it to the Student Billing team. Or students can search for their social insurance number online and submit it to Student Billing.
- Once registered, the University will automatically renew their medical insurance annually.

For International Students

International Health Insurance is compulsory for all international students. Suitable medical insurance will be arranged by RMIT Vietnam on student's behalf. Scan the QR code for more details.



For Students with Existing Insurance

If students have an existing medical insurance as arranged independently, and would like to request a medical insurance waiver, students must provide proof of insurance at least 10 days before the start of the semester via myRMIT.

Steps:

- Visit myRMIT: Find the Submit Request tile.
- Complete the Waiver Form: Choose either the Domestic Insurance Waiver form or the International Insurance Waiver form.
- Submit Supporting Documents: Provide evidence of existing insurance for review.
- Wait for results via email, or contact Student Connect for further assistance.

As RMIT parents and families, who should I contact for questions and support?

In special/emergency circumstances that students need to be absent from class, what should students do and how can parents/ families support them?

In circumstances that students might be absent from class or need special arrangements for their studies, students may consider taking the following steps as soon as they can:

Step 1: Notify lecturers: students should promptly inform their professors about the situation.

Step 2: Contact Student Connect for further advice.

Parents and families can provide emotional support and encourage students to access university resources and available student support services during their absence. Students always have direct access to their account on RMIT systems where they can make updates and requests 24/7 without the need to be on campus. Otherwise, if you need to talk to someone about your student's studies, you may consider contacting Family Connect for general advice regarding available student resources at RMIT.





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
